


Areas identified with a CSU stipulation are open to mineral easing but identified resource values require special operation constraints.	Areas identified with a TL stipulation are open to mineral leasing but surface use during specified time periods is prohibited to protect identified resource values.	Areas identified with a NSO stipulation are open to mineral leasing but use or occupancy of the surface for exploration and mineral development is prohibited in order to protect identified resource values. The minerals under NSO lands may potentially be developed by directionally or horizontally drilling from nearby lands that do not have the NSO limitation.	Areas open to mineral leasing are subject to existing laws, regulations, and formal orders; and the terms and conditions of the standard lease form.	Areas identified as closed are not open to mineral leasing.
